



1st Year Online Summer Exams

Overview of assessments in each subject

Subjects	Overview of online assessments in each subject
Irish	<p>Blend of Continuous Assessment 40% and 2 Final Online Written Assessments 60%. This grade will be broken down into a number of sections, taking students previous work both in school and online. The two final online assessments take place on Thursday, May 21st from 10.15am-11.15am and Monday, May 25th from 2.00pm-3.00pm. Each teacher will set assignments and due dates for online submissions via the classroom app. The common exams will cover the following topics; Mo theach agus mo cheantar, mo scoil, na séasúr agus laethanta saoire, grammar & poetry.</p>
English	<p>Blend of Continuous Assessment 40% and 2 Final Online Written Assessments 60%. The continuous assessment grade 40% will be awarded based on classroom engagement and effort throughout the year including class tests, classwork and homework. The final online assessments 60% will comprise of two final online written assessments. Task 1 on writing an email will be assigned Monday, May 18th from 9.00am-10.00am and Task 2 on a written dialogue/ drama script will be assigned on Wednesday, May 20th from 1.00pm-2.00pm. Each teacher will set assignments and due dates for online submissions via the classroom app.</p>
Maths	<p>Blend of Continuous Assessment 70% and Final Online Written Assessment 30% The final written exam will take place on Wednesday, May 20th from 9.00am-10.00am. It will be a timed online exam submitted via the classroom app. It will be a common paper for either higher/ordinary level students. The exam will cover the following topics; Chapter 8 - Algebra, Chapter 14 - Solving equations and Chapter 2 (Book 2) - Factorising. The continuous assessment mark will comprise of 10% for engagement with online teaching and learning and 60% for the average grade from all class test throughout the year including Christmas exam.</p>
Music	<p>Final Practical Video Online Submission 30% & Final Online Written Assessment 70% Students are required to submit a video recording of their practical music performance 30% to their music teacher. Guidelines on how to record and upload practical were issued to students and the deadline for submission is Thursday, May, 14th at 4.00pm (this week). The final written online exam 70% takes place on Monday, May 18th from 11.15am-12.15pm.</p>
Geography	<p>Blend of Continuous Assessment 60% & Final Online Written Assessment 40% The final written online exam 40% will take place on Tuesday, May 19th from 2.00pm-3.00pm and will be submitted online via Google Classroom. It will be a common paper for all first year students and will test all topics covered in first year. The continuous assessment grade of 60% will be based on a combination of other tests/assignments carried out throughout the year, as well as the student's level of engagement with online teaching and learning.</p>

Business Studies	<p>Blend of Continuous Assessment 60% & Final Online Written Assessment 40% The final written online exam 40% will take place on Wednesday, May 20th from 11.15am to 12.15pm and submitted online via google classroom or email. The test will cover chapters 1-6 of the Business Breakthrough book. Students are advised to focus on chapters 4+5 in particular for this assessment. The continuous assessment grade 60% will be based on a combination of the students level of engagement with online teaching and learning as well as other tests/assignments carried out throughout the year.</p>
Home Economics	<p>Blend of Final Practical Assessment 50% & Final Online Written Assessment 40% The 1st Year Cookery assignment is to be submitted before/on Monday, May 25th by 1.00pm. The open book online written assessment takes place on Monday, May 18th from 2.00pm-3.00pm. Guidelines on online submissions were provided by teachers on google classroom.</p>
Science	<p>Final Online Written Assessment 100% The final written online exam will take place on Friday, May 22nd from 11.15am to 12.15pm and submitted online via google classroom or email.</p>
Art	<p>Final Observational Drawing Exam 100%. The final drawing exam will take place <u>this week</u> on Tuesday, May 11th from 1.00pm-2.00pm and submitted via google classroom/email and the deadline for submission is on Friday, May 15th at 1.00pm. These are the art time slots on your home study timetable. The exam is common level and is focused on the topic of Portraiture and Elements of Art. Guidelines were issued to students on uploading work via google classroom/email by your art teacher. Equally, students can post exams to school's address. The deadline for submission of work via post will be provided by the teacher.</p>
Religion	<p>Blend of Project Assessment 60% & Final Online Written Assessment 40% Project task 60% will be posted on google classroom on Tuesday, May 12th (this week) to be completed and returned by Tuesday, May 19th. A multiple choice online written assessment 40% will take place on Thursday, May 21st from 12.00pm to 12.45pm (45mins).</p>
History	<p>Blend of Continuous Assessment 40% & Final Online Assessment 60% The continuous assessment grade 40% will be based on exams completed. The final online assessment 60%, takes place on Friday, May 22nd from 9.00am-10.00am. The Final exam will have three sections: Source Question; Short Answer Questions; Paragraph Question and will be completed online using a Google Form.</p>
French	<p>Blend of Continuous Assessment 60% & Final Online Assessment 40% The final online assessment 40% task, takes place on Tuesday, May 19th from 9.00am-10.00am and submission will be via the google classroom. The continuous assessment grade 60% will be based on a combination of the student's level of engagement with online teaching and learning as well as other class tests, oral and written assignments carried out throughout the year.</p>
German	<p>Blend of Continuous Assessment 50%, Final Assessment 40% & Level of Online Engagement 10% 50% -Continuous Assessment based on class tests completed since September 2019. 40% - Final assessment task on Tuesday, May 19th from 9.00am-10.00am. Students will be asked to record a sound file with their answers to a series of blog questions This will be an open book assessment and will test comprehension, language acquisition and accuracy as well as oral skills. 10% - level of online engagement in remote teaching and learning since school closure.</p>
